these kids are happy they get two days off on the weekend in high school yeah that's it teens in China being so happy that they get two days off on the weekend well I would be happy too if this is how they teach kids in China now in China there's something called a morning reading session and the point is you read out loud so it helps you to you to remember the concepts or whatever you're learning but some sometimes it goes really extreme is this education or a rap practice oh do you also really need to recite during lunch as well this honestly makes the New York Stock Exchange trading floor look like a library the school in that first video then sent out a notice to parents saying that you guys have to gaset your kids at home to force them to come back on Saturday because you know we don't want some kids to feel like they uh they they get the freedom While others are forced by their parents all of you have to do this gaslighting on your kids now in China if I had to stay there I would have to go to essentially a very far for middle school and even high school because I was from a town where they didn't have a middle or high school so that means I would start to live in a dorm at the school starting in grade six and so you can imagine if you're constantly at school you're essentially doing morning uh self sessions or late night studying sessions and then on Saturday and Sunday they might force you to do these voluntary study sessions you probably be wound up feeling quite depressed isolated and you just want to escape to home and this is not a movie scene this is a student Revolution kids throwing paper into the schoolyard to protest the school so-called voluntary study sessions on Saturday an indirect 6 days a week forcing kids to be at school at all times they toss paper into the yard as an act of defiance this all happened at the number one high school in rujo which is in the province of Hunan why well this picture might be able to explain it the comment here is from a student who explains that this school where the paper protest happened are cream of the crop students from that area they all want to study well and do really well in school but they also want to be able to enjoy their legal and well-deserved weekends so that school held emergency meetings with parents and then Witnesses recount that subsequently kids and their parents had arguments and fights in the hallway you know pinpointing the blames away from the school that's exactly what the administrators at that school wants they want to shift the blames back to the students saying they're the disruptors they're the ones who are defiant from wanting a better education which obviously in their view means more times at school but eventually the students did win the school issued a announcement saying

that they will get a two-day weekend and just a quick reminder if you enjoy China insiders video consider subscribing if you haven't already and also check out this crazy tofu drag specialist hat which you can get at Davis an.net in a country where a college degree means nothing because everybody and their mom and dad has one and the oversaturation of the workforce means you simply have to do every little detail perfect and hopefully you can land a job later on the government's solution is to work everybody to their bones in hopes that their Workforce will be able to continuously provide cheap labor uh pretty pointless production because they're expendable and for kids the government solution is study until you drop there's recently a wave of students offing if you know what I mean one after another because of the mental pressure because of the extreme amount of work that they have to be put up with and obviously the isolation like I mentioned that they feel away from home isn't that itself counterproductive already study or education is supposed to be nurturing the brain not neutering the brain right yet in China it seems like their way is to force everybody to use time and hours in exchange for some sort of a gaining education this kind of relates to why China can't innovate but they can copycat and repr produced really well because they training their young kids to do precisely that to recite what's already been written in the texts rather than going out and exploring and finding new ways now obviously I'm not talking about the CCP officials kids who obviously get to go through the best schools and they actually teach you to innovate in those schools well I'm talking about just the regular folks sure Chinese people may be smart but they're never taught that there's another way to learning Chinese people are just test machines uh they're really good at writing tests repeating the answers but they're not really good at creating something out of nothing cuz you know totally right test scores is how Bill Gates and the Elon musks are born into this world the recent offing of students is just one of the many reasons why some schools are actually enacting those two- dat weekends now which we'll talk about later but this was never really about education it's really about total control in these videos you see that starting at a young age elementary students they're already incorporated into the CCP system these are what part of their kids club in the CCP called the you the young Pioneer which they get to wear the red scarves and here they have to raise their fist to show allegiance to pledge loyalty to the Communist Party when they're you know six seven years old and as part of that brainwashing apparatus so not only are they just taught to be test machines they also have to be brainwashed into believing what the government what the party is doing for them in terms of education is the one and only way that things can be

achieved and we know that China has the 996 work culture right so consider the 6: a.m. to 11:00 p.m. study hours as sort of the Preparatory course pipeline to feed into the 996 work culture many students in China rack up to 100 plus hours a week in just study time now unlike the Other Extreme East Asian countries like Japan and South Korea where they you know in Japan in 2002 they abolished the 6 days a week for schooling although some lawmakers in Japan are trying to bring that back but Korea also has not been doing they've been basically doing the 5 days like most countries in the world uh and so despite them in similarity in terms of the the pressure that students feel they're doing 5 days a week but the fact that you have kids here celebrating a simple gesture of schools letting them to go home on a Friday afternoon instead of The Saturdays is just it's the most bizarre thing that I can watch today since last year there's already been many schools in China um kids protesting this 6 days a week 7 days a week situation and it's been gaining a lot of traction this school here had students riding on blackboards that they were tired and want to weekend here another school this one uh early last year kids screaming double weeken off and this one here is in a whe Muslim school students are fed up with only a total of 22 hours in terms of time off in a week so I assume that's you know Sunday last year many schools had smaller protest because students were told to go to school even on national holiday which is supposed to be a a date of time off and this one here students walking to the athletic field to protest asking for two days off now it recently exploded in China which is some of the other factors why they're now doing the two days off in certain areas uh this new uh movement called the 61. IU which I previously had talked about where students in China can use firewall to come over and fill out in a form where they can describe what school they're at what grade how many hours in total they study in a week and then also talk about some of the uh situations of what students are going through for example are there any students who off them because you know they couldn't handle the pressure things like that at the time of recording there's about 4,000 entries so 4,000 different schools that uh students have reported experiencing some level of sort of abuse one way or another in its second phase you have about 260 270 entries of schools who enacted this voluntary study session which I talked about is just another excuse for them to stay another day at school picture this right you have a 15-year-old scanny kid every single morning they wake up at 5:00 they have to go to class for a 6:00 a.m. study session which runs all the way till 9:00 then they go to school maybe around 3: to 4:00 p.m. they get off school eat dinner then it's time for their night study session which could run anywhere from you know 6 7 8 9 10 11 and there's no time for things

like fortnite or video games in general I guess or even Sports in some cases it's just a math workbook and a clock ticking that's their Monday through Saturday and then on Sunday you know many of them don't go home right because it's just one day off what they do is they stay in the dorm and they barely get enough rests so it's this meat grinder type of schedule students aren't really students they're more like cogs on the wheel it's no wonder you see kids here at this one picture he's got gray hair and he looks like he's maybe 15 14 so like I mentioned because many uh schools got Exposed on the 61. IU forum for they have to well basically give up the Saturday event and uh force a two-day long two-day weekend for them and others took the form of giving more time off to students such as starting the semester later or actually giving them national holidays off as well there's some comedic ones too where students arrived at the school gate and then being told to go home because we're starting school another week or we're delaying the first day of the semester now some parents of course think that there's bit of a complaining to do here frustration that kids get you know time off uh in this chat group here for example parents are complaining that they don't themselves don't even get you know 5 days uh two days off on the weekend how come their kids get to stay home and play video games seems unfair well I think you're probably not shouldn't be worried about the situation with with your kids you should probably talk about why you're being worked to the bones but I do understand the parents perspective right because it's super competitive in China you don't have enough jobs the only way for you to feel like you did a lot for your kid especially because you know many families are one child only is that you brought them to college and they graduated with a degree even though it's pretty worthless uh let's be honest but it's a sense of Duty that Chinese parents have and they feel like the only way for them to maintain that for their kids is if they push them to study harder study harder and study harder now the question becomes what the schools then Force parents to pay extra money now on Saturday for tutoring sessions or or with the school find new ways to you know get more time and extract more energy out of the students because like I mentioned the bigger issue at play is here well you know you're sending the people into the workforce into 996 work culture part of me feel hopeful for the kids because you know they're learning to protest and that they're fighting for their for their legality right but in another part of me I'm also fearful because once they get into the real world once they start to learn that 996 is the reality for people for a white collar job uh will they feel defeated it's no wonder you know the broader idea is that the CCP obviously needs its you know Expendable resources but that's also what some young people
